Subject:- Grant of Conditional Permission to Bundelkhand Govt. Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Gwalior Road, Jhansi-284001, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0246) with intake capacity of 41 seats (51 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder -regarding.

#### Sir/Madam,

- 1. With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.
- 2. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Bundelkhand Govt. Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Gwalior Road, Jhansi-284001, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0246), inspection of your college was conducted on 12.02.2024 & 13.02.2024 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional Permission with intake capacity of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.
- 3. Further, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Post-graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder. On careful examination of the assessment report it is found that your college is not fulfilling the notified and approved criteria due to the following shortcoming:-

#### 1) Teaching staff:-

- a) Availability of total teaching staff for issuance of extension of conditional permission for intake capacity with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) Course is  $\frac{Availtable}{Required} x100\% = \frac{20}{30} x100\% = 66.66\%$  (Excluding Excess and including visitor observation).
- b) Sanskrit teacher is not available
- c) Yoga teacher is not available.
- d) Biostatistician is not available.

- 4. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the 87<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 25.04.2024. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above, the Board discussed and decided to provide an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARB-ISM letter (Hearing notice) of even number dated 01.05.2024 to appear before the designated Hearing Committee on 03.05.2024, to present their case and to show cause as to why not the conditional permission to the college with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2024-25. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof to substantiate the claims against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter no. 200/2024-25/NCISM hearing, dated 02.05.2024 against the deficiencies conveyed to them.
- 5. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Dr. Ramakrishna Rathod, Principal & Dr.Alok Singh, Associate Professor of the college,** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **03.05.2024** and made their submission virtually as well as written, against the shortcomings communicated to the college. college can not show him as their regular teaching staff in any manner. Hence, the submission was not considered. Hence, shortcoming

c) College authorities stated that they have sent a demand letter to higher officials in this regard, but no recruitment has taken place.

It is observed that as on date there is no Yoga teacher available in the college, Hence, short coming persists.

d) College authorities stated that they have sent a demand letter to higher officials in this regard, but no recruitment has taken place.

It is observed that as on date there is no Biostatistician available in the college, Hence, short coming persists.

e) College authorities have stated that, for the fulfilment of these posts, UPPSC, Prayagraj has already made an advertisement and shortly the lower faculties will be recruited and for remaining higher faculties a demand letter has been sent to the higher authorities. But as on date no recruitments have been taken place.

It is observed that as on date there is no teaching faculty recruited against the shortcomings posts mentioned in point number e) regarding lower faculty and higher faculty.

- Dr.Madhusingh (AYRN00497), who is working as Associate Professor in the dept.of RNVV has been shown as Assistant Professor in Part-I, due to pending approval from NCISM.
- After verification, the faculty may be considered in the post of Associate Professor, in RNVV.

But after consideration of Dr.Madhusingh to the post of Associate Professor in RNVV, the lower faculty in RNVV shortcoming arises.

Hence, the shortcoming persists.

Post hearing submission-

Dr. Alok Singh Sengar Associate professor in department of Ayurveda Samhita siddhantawas not added in part -1 and verified by the visitors on the day of visitation. On OTMS the teacher is linked to the college therefore may be considered as eligible teacher. As per the shortcoming of 1LF in Samhita siddhanta department it can be adjusted with 1 HF.

After observation regarding hospital staff, Panchakarma Assistant 1, Analytical chemist (part-time) 1 and Pharmacognosist (part-time) 1 may be considered and The total eligible hospital staff will become 33 and as on date, the remaining posts as mentioned in the short comings of Hospital staff are vacant and not filled.

Hence, the shortcoming in hospital staff persists. (short coming of 12)

- Thereafter, the observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016, "The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2022 and relevant regulations thereunder, and once again as per the direction of President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM), the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the 89<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 10.05.2024.
- Further, the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and the Board observed that the college is not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission for UG (BAMS) Course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 for the Academic Session 2024-25. However, the Board decided to issue Conditional Permission for the UG course as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2024-25, wherein it is mentioned that:
  - a. "For deficiency of **every one teacher**, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5 % of total intake capacity."

Accordingly as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016 the deficiency of teacher for up to sixty intake capacity shall not exceed more than ten percent of total requirement. As per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the 89<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of MARBISM, college is having only **21 total eligible teaching faculties.** 

There is deficiency of **06 teachers** for issuance of Conditional Permission for academic session 2024-25 as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016. Therefore, in accordance with seat reduction policy 2024-2025, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 30% of total intake capacity.

b. "For every 10% deficiency in hospital staff, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by one seat."

Accordingly as per Schedule–IV Note (5) of MSR 2016 the deficiency of hospital staff for up to sixty intake capacity shall not exceed more than twenty percent of total requirement. As per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the 89<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of MARBISM, college is having only 73.91% which is rounded off to 70%.

There is deficiency of 10% against the minimum requirement of hospital staff for issuance of Conditional Permission for academic session 2024-25 as per Schedule–IV Note (5) of MSR 2016. Therefore, in accordance with seat reduction policy 2024-2025, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake seat strength by one seat.

Hence, after applying the seat reduction policy 2024-25 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 41 seats (51 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.

- 8. Therefore, Conditional Permission is granted to Bundelkhand Govt. Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Gwalior Road, Jhansi-284001, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0246) with intake capacity of 41 seats (51 seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that college is fulfilling the following conditions as mentioned below: -
  - It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of **41 seats (51 seats including EWS)** [instead of **60 seats (75 seats including EWS)**] in **UG Course** shall be treated as All India Quota. The counseling for seats under All India Quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for All India Quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
- Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 10. Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular or the subsequent academic year.
- 11. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

- 12. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2024 and compliance report should be sent to get permission for the academic session 2025-2026:
  - All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
  - All the requirements of minimum standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in MES ii) (Assessment & Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
  - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate iii) Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022.
  - iv) The shortcoming mentioned in Para no. 7 above, should be fulfilled.
- The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
